#### **Behaviour Policy Review**

We are currently working behind the scenes, to develop a new school behaviour policy. We currently use Golden Time, however; we feel that with the changes to society post pandemic and the challenges faced in school by some children with regards to anxiety and mental health, the time is right to make some changes.

Mr Williamson and I are currently reading up to date research to ensure that any changes we make are suited to our school community. We always have high expectations of behaviour and we seek to create an environment which encourages and reinforces positive behaviour and fosters positive attitudes. There are occasions when we will need to deal with poor behaviour choices and the policy will outline any sanctions for poor choices, should they arise.

## Latest COVID-19 guidance from the Department for Education- we have several confirmed cases in school, please look out for symptoms.

- Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel
  unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough
  to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.
