# **Sporting Success**

# **Maths Day**

The whole school loved our Maths Day on Monday! Mr Williamson was so pleased to see children from every year group enjoying maths when he

visited every classroom. In addition to their usual maths lessons, children used maths to solve problems, investigate and solve maths puzzles. Children in Year 1 even used maths to set up a tea party, making sure food was shared equally! Well done everyone!

# **Healthy School**

We will shortly be renewing our Heathy School status and as part of this process we are reviewing our Healthy Eating Policy.

As Headteacher and as a parent, I always find conversations about healthy eating a little tricky. Every family is different, has different routines, values and tastes. Some of our families are advocates for healthy eating/special diets however others believe that 'everything in moderation' is the best approach. As a school we deliver some information to children about healthy eating as part of the science, PSHE, DT (cooking) and PE curriculum. Our healthy eating policy contains guidance for families about why children need to eat well and sets out our responsibility to the children in regards to modelling healthy habits.

The full policy can be found on our website. Below I have pulled out some of the key points:











- At Donisthorpe we recognise the important part a healthy diet plays for a child's wellbeing and their ability to learn effectively and achieve.
- We aim to ensure that healthy food and drink is provided, taking account of individual needs (e.g. cultural, ethical, medial), reflecting nutrition and healthy eating messages in the curriculum, and with the support of the whole school.

#### Curriculum

• The subject leaders for PSHE, PE and DT are jointly responsible for what is taught about healthy eating and practical food education in the curriculum.

#### **School meals**

- All our school meals cooked on site in accordance with the School Food Standards. A copy of the menu and is sent home via email. The dining area has a calm and positive atmosphere where children socialise and enjoy the dining experience. Staff encourage pupils to try new foods, we encourage all parents to take free school meals, where there is an entitlement.
- Special diets and allergies are catered for after discussion with parents.

#### **Packed Lunches**

- We ask that packed lunches do not include:
  - o Fizzy, sugary drinks
  - Nuts (we are a nut free school)
- Parents are asked to refrain from providing food products, which may contain nuts, in packed lunches or any other food brought into the school. Staff are trained to recognise and manage allergic reactions.
- Parents/carers are responsible for providing a packed lunch container where food items can be stored securely and appropriately until the lunchtime period. In warm temperatures, it is advised that an ice pack is included in the food container.

#### **Snacks**

- All EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 classes receive a free morning break time snack of fruit or vegetables.
- Milk is provided free for under-fives and is available at cost for those over five in the rest of the school.
- Key Stage 2 children are asked to bring in a healthy snack preferably, fruit (fresh or dried) or vegetables for playtime. Fizzy drinks, sweets, crisps and chocolate biscuits are not allowed.

### **Events and Celebrations**

- We want to give children the opportunity to celebrate their birthdays. If parents want to bring something in to celebrate birthdays we ask that children talk these items home to enjoy. This is optional. (Nut free please)
- We have a number of fundraising opportunities throughout the year and limit cake sales to roughly one per term.

#### Water for all

• Children are encouraged to drink water regularly throughout the day and have water bottles in class.
