

Hill Street Baptist Church clothes bank

With the cost of living being so high and with many more families struggling, I thought I would let you know about the clothes bank at Hill Street Baptist Church. Hill Street Baptist Church is located in Swadlincote and is open most Fridays 1-4pm. The clothes bank is run by a lovely lady called Louise, who is very supportive and is also able to signpost families to different services if needed. The clothes bank is for men, women and children and there is also a vast amount of school uniform available. It is a warm and friendly space and there is absolutely no judgement made. Measles outbreak

You will have seen in the news that there have been serious outbreaks of measles over the last month. Outbreaks are now occurring widely in England, with teenagers being those most affected. This is because many of them missed out on their MMR vaccinations in the late 1990s and early 2000s when the vaccine was mistakenly linked to cases of autism.

These outbreaks are a serious concern with up to a million children and young teenagers potentially vulnerable to infection, especially as children of this age are going into secondary school where the spread of infection is much more likely to happen.

We have had no reported cases of measles at our school. We ask parents to let us know if their children have any symptoms so that we can put additional measures in place.

If your child does contract measles they should:

- stay off school or work for at least 4 days from when the rash first appears
- regularly wash your hands with soap
- use and dispose of tissues when you sneeze
- avoid close contact with anyone who isn't fully vaccinated



Daily, thorough cleaning in school alongside encouraging regular handwashing and hygiene with the children will ensure that we protect out school community.

Water Safety Code


Water may look safe, but it can be dangerous. Learn to spot and keep away from dangers. You may swim well in a warm indoor pool, but that does not mean that you will be able to swim in cold water.

Stop and think - spot the dangers

There are many dangers with water, which can include:

- It can be very cold
- There may be hidden currents

Water Safety Code



- It can be difficult to get out (steep slippery banks)
- It can be deep
- There may be hidden rubbish, e.g. shopping trolleys, broken glass
- There may be no lifeguards there
- It is difficult to estimate depth
- It may be polluted and may make you ill

Stay together

- It is always better to go to the water with a friend or family member
- Children should always go near water with an adult
- An adult can point out dangers or help if somebody gets into trouble.

Float

If you fall into the water unexpectedly – float until you can control your breathing. Then call for help or swim to safety.

Call 999

You may be able to help yourself and others if you know what to do in an emergency. If you see someone in difficulty, tell somebody, preferably a Lifeguard if there is one nearby, or go to the nearest telephone, dial 999, ask for the Fire Service at inland water sites and the Coastguard at the beach.

Parking Safely at Donisthorpe Primary School

Inconsiderate and dangerous parking around our school has become a big problem, putting the safety of children and others at risk.

We all want to keep our children safe, so here are some top tips on how you can make a difference.

How Can You Help?

- ✓ Keep your speed down
- ✓ Turn your engine off if leaving your vehicle
- ✓ Leave the middle of the road free, with enough room for other road users to easily pass through
- ✓ Make sure your child leaves and enters your vehicle safely onto the pavement
- ✓ Check for pedestrians and cyclists before opening a car door
- ✓ Leave enough room on pavements for pedestrians to get past
- ✓ Take care when reversing

- ✓ Zig Zags and School Entrances
- ✓ Dropped Kerbs
- ✓ Resident's Driveways

Please park considerately and keep our children safe!
