Parent Code of Conduct

Issues of conduct with the use of Social Media

We ask that you use common sense when discussing school life online and 'Think before you post'. We ask that social media, whether public or private, should not be used to voice complaints against the school, staff, parents or children. We take very seriously inappropriate use of social media by a parent to publicly criticise another parent, member of staff or child. We encourage parents to make use of the school's open door policy to approach the school to help resolve any issues of concern.
